

THESE YOUNG MEN face a great year! They hold fellowships for Advanced Study, honoring the memory of Rotary's late Founder. Stipends range from \$1,800 to \$2,900 and are from the Paul Herris Memorial Fund of the Rotary Foundation. Winners were selected after screening of candidates in Districts.



STEWART COLE BLASIER

A career in foreign affairs is one reason why this Michigan man (Grosse Pointe) wishes to study at the University of Chile in Santiago. At George Washington University be studied Latin America's history, government, and economics. Speaks French and Spanish. Was U.S. Navy Task Group Supply Officer. Student leader at University of Illinois.



AUBREY GOLDSMITH DAVIES






